# Save the Date to be Part of a Movement—Diocese of Boise Joins National Eucharistic Procession!

From May 27<sup>th</sup> to May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, the Diocese of Boise will take part in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, hosting a dozen young adults as they process with the Blessed Sacrament on their way to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July. These four national teams embark on their cross-country pilgrimage on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024. Along the way, they will stop at parishes to pray, process, and gather, unified around the Blessed Sacrament. This unprecedented opportunity allows the faithful in Idaho to join with one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history, as part of the national Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

On May 27<sup>th</sup>, Bishop Peter will meet Bishop Cary of the Diocese of Baker on the border between Oregon and Idaho, where they will solemnly transfer the Blessed Sacrament to our diocese. The Eucharistic procession will continue across the southern portion of the state before it crosses the border into Utah. The national team will make four major stops in our diocese: Corpus Christi in Fruitland; the Cathedral of St. John in Boise: St. Edward's in Twin Falls; and Holy Spirit Catholic Community in Pocatello. Save the date and plan to pray, process and be part of this historic event! More information to come on ways in which all communities will be able to participate.

# God offers himself to us in the manger in Bethlehem, inviting each heart to welcome this heavenly gift. "At

Christmas, we on earth receive Jesus, the bread from heaven," Pope Francis said in St. Peter's Basilica. "We discover that the life of God can enter into our hearts and dwell there."

"If we welcome that gift, history changes, starting with each of us. For once Jesus dwells in our heart, the center of life is no longer my ravenous and selfish ego, but the One who is born and lives for love," he added. Francis explained that "God makes himself small so that he can be our food. By feeding on him, the bread of life, we can be reborn in love, and break the spiral of grasping and greed."

"Standing before the manger, we understand that the food of life is not material riches but love, not gluttony but charity, not ostentation but simplicity," he said. The pope extended a challenge to simplify one's life and to share with others at Christmastime. Francis encouraged everyone to ask themselves, "At Christmas do I break my bread with those who have none?"

"I want to come to Bethlehem, Lord, because there you await me. I want to realize that you, lying in a manger, are the bread of my life. I need the tender fragrance of your love so that I, in turn, can be bread broken for the world," Pope Francis said.
