The Message of Fatima Today

While many people have a great devotion to Our
Lady of Fatima, it seems as though the world is
in nearly the same state now as it was when
Mary appeared in Fatima. We still need to pray
the Rosary, work to convert sinners (ourselves

Images of Christians in Syria, Pakistan, the

us to pray for peace. Indeed, Christianity is now
the most persecuted religion in the world. The
message of Fatima is needed now more than
ever. The 100th anniversary is a great reminder
that all of us are called to this message of peace
and prayer.

-Perform and spread devotions to the Immaculate
Heart of Mary.

-Make reparation for blasphemies and outrages
against Mary's Immaculate Heart, especially by
performing the Five First Saturday's devotion.

-Pray, fast, and do penance for the conversion of
poor sinners and to make reparation for the sins of
the world.

-Consecrate yourself to the Immaculate Heart.

-Pray the Rosary daily for peace in the world.

*Our Lady said to the three shepherd children at Fatima, Portugal, on
July 13, 1917, "Continue to say the Rosary every day in honor of Our
Lady of the Rosary, to obtain the peace of the world and the end of the
war, because only she can obtain it." She reiterated that call throughout
her apparitions there, saying in May 1917, "Say the Rosary every day, to
bring peace to the world and an end to the war [World War I]," and in
September, "Continue the Rosary, my children. Say it every day that the
war may end."*
